MEMBERSHIP BYE-LAWS

1. There will be three classes of membership open to anyone living within the Parish of Stoke Climsland, or if living outside, to anyone sharing the aims and objectives of the Old School.

All classes of membership shall have equal voting rights at any meeting save that in the case of a Family membership only the adults shall have a vote each.
 - a) Individual
 - b) Family, to cover a couple and any children living with them and being under 18 years.
 - c) Life membership open to any individual who is prepared to make a one time payment usually 10 times the current annual membership fee. Life memberships are not transferable or refundable.
From time to time the Trustees may propose to the Annual General Meeting that People who have made an overwhelming contribution to the Old School over a period of many years be made Honorary Life members.
2. The membership year shall run from 1st September to 31st August.
3. The membership fees shall be set by the Trustees from time to time for the forthcoming year subject to the approval of the AGM.
4. Members who fail to renew their membership within 3 months of the start of the membership year will be deemed to be lapsed members and shall not be able to participate in the activities normally associated with membership as from that date until they renew their membership.
 - a) Trustees, currently limited to 12 in number, shall be appointed from the membership in accordance with the procedure set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association.
 - b) Anyone elected as a Trustee must renew membership promptly or be deemed to have resigned as a Trustee with effect from the beginning of the membership year. They may stand for re-election once they are in good standing as a member.
5. Memberships to be approved by the Trustees at the next Board meeting following receipt of a written application form: approval will not normally be withheld but the Trustees do retain the right to either ask a member to withdraw or to withhold Membership to anyone they feel do not fully accept the aims and objectives of the Old School.
 - a) Any dispute arising from the use of this power shall ultimately be referred to a general meeting of members
6. Formal notices to members will be deemed to have been given once published in the Newsletter or some other publication being made available regularly to members
